Virginia's Nuclear Energy Assets


- Close proximity to the NRC, DOE and Washington, DC
- Nuclear engineering degree programs at VT and VCU
 - Other related programs at the UVA, GMU, ODU, and GWU
- Major nuclear energy industry companies in Virginia include:
 - Areva
 - B&W
 - Mitsubishi
 - Toshiba
- The nuclear navy also has a large presence in Virginia Newport News Shipbuilding and Norfolk Naval Shipyard
- Dominion Power operates two nuclear power stations in Virginia (Surry and North Anna) and together, these four units produce close to 40% of the electricity produced in the state.

Virginia Nuclear Energy Consortium

- An interdisciplinary study, research and information resource for the Commonwealth of Virginia on nuclear energy
- Major activities include:
 - Educational program and curriculum development
 - Shared laboratory and research facilities
 - Community and K-12 outreach programs
 - Conferences and workshops in nuclear energy







Virginia Nuclear Energy Consortium

- Created by legislation from the 2013 VA General Assembly effective July 1, 2013
- Board includes six (6) private sector representatives from the nuclear energy industry
- Board includes VCCS, VT, UVA, VCU, GMU and two other rotating university members
- The membership of the Consortium shall be open to:
 - Public or private institutions of higher education in the Commonwealth;
 - Virginia-based federal research laboratories;
 - Nuclear energy-related nonprofit organizations;
 - Business entities with operating facilities located in the Commonwealth that are engaged in activities directly related to the nuclear energy industry;
